As per the news, it has been reported that a limited number of 13 hospitals out of 36 in Gaza are currently operational. There are ongoing violent clashes in the vicinity of Nasser and Al-Amal hospitals in Khan Younis, and a significant number of around 6,000 patients are awaiting evacuation from Gaza for treatment. It has been observed that only 10 (16%) of the 61 planned humanitarian missions in the northern Gaza Valley were authorised last month, primarily for food distribution, but not for other water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) services or hospital supplies.

Additionally, it was noted that greenhouse gas emissions, which contribute to climate change, should be harmonized with the net zero emission target. It is declared that millions of Palestinians are penalized by being deprived of their basic right to life. Furthermore, it has been observed that the decision of certain countries to withdraw their support for UNRWA could exacerbate this situation, and therefore it has been recommended that UNRWA should be provided with the necessary support. It has been stressed that the right of the Palestinian people to self-determination and the establishment of their own state must be respected. The recommendations emphasized the significance of avoiding the use of food as a weapon of war and take steps to facilitate the entry of sufficient, reliable, sustainable and unhindered aid and basic goods into Gaza. A committee will be formed to follow up on the recommendations made by the participants and to ensure the develop of the four-year implementation plan. During the discussion. the significance of collaboration among
